First, according to my sources, the ordnance plant used to dump bad batches of TNT near the twin lakes on NASA property. Has any testing been done in this area and what were the results?

Second, has the location of the twin lakes been defined in relation to aquifers that exist under Erie County?


Third, has the Army Corps of Engineers reviewed the groundwater studies performed around the Erie County Landfill in Milan Township? The Ohio EPA and Metcalf and Eddy (a consulting firm working for the Erie County Engineers) have both performed studies to determine the extent of groundwater contamination of benzene, toluene and acetone in AND around the area. Erie County has implied that the contamination from NASA is flowing four miles southeast to this area. Is this probable?

Fourth, how long have federal, state and local governments been aware of the potential problem(s) caused by this site?

Please send as much engineering information as possible. I hold two degrees in Engineering so the technical verbiage will not be a problem.
