Hi Dave

It just dawned on me that you were referring to the "Focused Feasibility Study." I have skimmed it but am taking another look at it.

The one concern that comes to mind though is regarding composting. Based upon the comments from the RAB, I think they would like us to consider composting as opposed to dig and dispose. From what I observed at the meeting, it appeared that Rick was seriously willing to consider this. If we go forward with the dig, treat and dispose option we had better seriously make the argument that it was not cost effective, so that the RAB will understand that we did consider their opinion.

I also thought that the purpose of the revised FFS was to propose the composting alternative but it was ruled out as an alternative due to cost?

The e-mail on Dec. 9th was sent in regard to the soil removal work plans. The e-mail was not for the Focused Feasibility Study Document. Yesterday, I had sent you a follow-up email regarding the FFS in which I raised a question or more appropriately a concern.

Since yesterday I have completed my review. The FFS document is acceptable and Alternative 2 will meet the requirements.

I would still like you to check with Rick Meadows regarding his comments from the Restoration Advisory Board Meeting on December the 11th. Was he implying that the Army Corps would consider the composting alternative or was he saying that they would do it at Plum Brook?

I agree with the FFS document as written. I just want to provide a heads up for the group that there may be some feedback at the next RAB. As I stated in my earlier e-mail we will need to make it very clear that the dig, treat, and dispose alternative was the most economically feasible.

I will be sending Linda Ingram a hard copy of our approval through the mail.
